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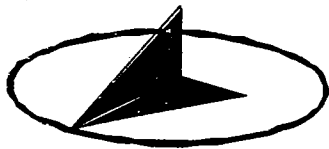
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Ron Rood passed out the 2000 Prehistory and Heritage Posters. Drawn by Whitney Parker age 12.

## LODGING INFORMATION

### Official Lodging Locations

Two downtown hotels, the **Ben Lomond Hotel** and **Ogden Marriott** are the official hotels for the 2000 GBAC. Room blocks have been reserved from Wednesday night (10/4) through Saturday night (10/7). Our GBAC conference number is 58513. In order to be guaranteed a room at the conference rates, *you must make your reservation before September 4, 2000*. After this date, rooms will be released for general sale. The below-listed room rates do not include a local accommodations tax, which currently is 9.25%.

The historic **Ben Lomond Hotel**, (which is a return to its original name after being named the Ogden Radisson for many years) was built in 1927, and is located at 2510 Washington Boulevard, across the street from the David Eccles Conference Center. Single or double occupancy rates are \$59/night for a hotel room and \$62/night for a suite (add \$12 for each additional adult). Check-in and check-out times are 3 p.m. and noon, respectively. For reservations at the Radisson, call (801) 627-1900.

The not-so-historic **Ogden Marriott** is located at 247 24<sup>th</sup> Street, about three blocks west of the Conference Center. Single or double occupancy rates are \$79/night. The Marriott has a large, outdoor parking area and is adjacent to Ogden's Historic 25<sup>th</sup> Street core, featuring a number of good restaurants and fun private clubs (where temporary memberships can be purchased). Guests at the Marriott Hotel can obtain a free guest membership to that hotel's private club, where mixed drinks are sold. Check-in and check-out times are 3 p.m. and noon, respectively. ### Additional Lodging

There are several motels in the downtown Ogden area that offer lower individual room rates than the above two hotels. ## TRANSPORTATION

Salt Lake City International Airport is 35 miles south of Ogden. Arrangements have been made for a shuttle service to and from Ogden. The fare is \$10 one way and \$20 round trip.
